County Charts Fire, Garbage Plan Huddles

MURRAY — Method for Salt Lake County to provide fire protection and garbage collection for three towns will be ironed out at a meeting soon of county commissioners and town board members.

COMMISSION Chairman Lamont B. Gundersen said Saturday he is attempting to arrange a meeting with South Jordan, West Jordan and Riverton officials in the near future.

Until now the county has provided the services for the three incorporated areas. However, under the recent services plan passed by the commission in

compliance with a new state law, expenses for these services must be paid by the recipients.

Mr. Gundersen said the commission believes a contract can be signed where the towns will pay the county for the services, thus saving the towns from purchasing and maintaining fire and garbage departments, Commissioner Gundersen said.

He pointed out similar agreements are in effect in Utah and Davis Counties. Those counties contract with cities to provide fire protection.

Mr. Gundersen said the plan

will provide approximately \$100,000 more a year for the fire department. This year's budget was \$255,000.

"However, we may lose some of that money this year from the share of automobile valuation upon which taxes have already been paid," he declared.

Additional revenue is needed in the county for construction of fire stations in the East Mill Creek-Holladay, Butler, and Granger areas.

THE DEPARTMENT will be expanded as rapidly as possible to provide adequate protection for all the fast-growing areas in the county, he said.

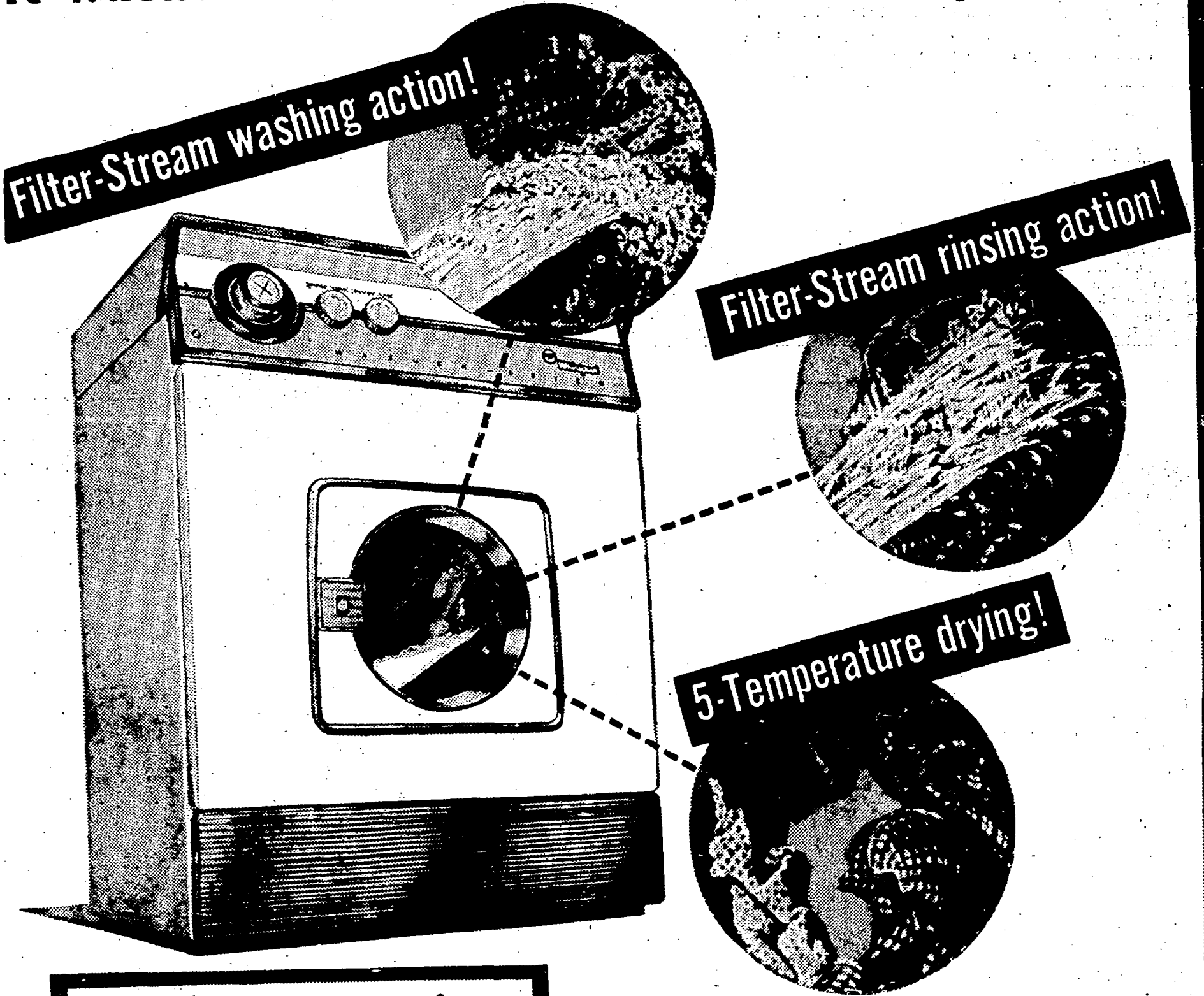
