

## SALLY KNIGHT

Sally Knight was born December 1, 1836 in Galliton Twp. Clay, Missouri to Newel Knight and Lydia Goldthwaite. Married Zemira Palmer December 1, 1851. They had twelve children: six sons and six daughters. Died October 1, 1916 in Orderville, Kane, Utah. Buried October 3, 1916 in Orderville, Kane, Utah.

Sally was only 11 when her father died. She was the oldest child. Sally was baptized into the Church in 1844 but it wasn't until after the birth of their first child that she and Zemira were sealed.

Sally was a very ambitious woman and did many things to earn a living for her family after her husband died. At one time she and a son milked 47 cows. She would stay up late at night sewing carpet rags. She would take old clothes and make them like new again and could take food and make a wonderful meal out of almost anything. She was a great worrier. She always thought of others first. She was a very economical and thrifty woman. She was more or less an invalid during her child-bearing years and had to get around a lot by sliding on a chair. She had auburn hair and brownish eyes with yellow flecks.

She lived in Provo and Heber City, Utah; in Panaca, Lincoln, Nevada; Southern Utah to look after the cotton industry, and Orderville, Utah when her husband was called to be the leader of the United Order.

Zemira died at the early age of 49 leaving Sally with a two year old child and nine other children to care for. Also six children by his second wife who had died before Zemira.

It was Sally's desire that she die and be buried in Orderville so her son took her there and she died at 65.
